

Community Group Invitation Worksheet

This is my first community group. Who should I invite? This worksheet is intended to get your list going.

First off, think of your meeting space. If you're meeting in your home, how many can you comfortably fit in your living room? If you're meeting in a business, are there space or sound limitations to consider? Generally, community groups work best with 6-14 members. Of course the space available in your home will determine the maximum size for your group. Remember that everyone will need to be able to see the video. Once you have an idea of how many you can comfortably accommodate in your meeting space, you can start on your list.

Remember that community groups are designed to be open to the community. The members of your community group don't need to be part of First UMC. Our desire is that new community groups will be intentional about including people who are not part of any church. Another aspect of community groups is the creation and nurture of Christian community. It's great to have group members who are active and engaged at First UMC or another church, too.

With those things in mind, use the area below to brainstorm names you can invite to join you for your 6 week study (and possibly beyond, should you all desire to continue).
