

Thank you for volunteering to be a bell ringer for The Salvation Army. Below are the details for your kettle shift. This year we are implementing new protocols to ensure the health and safety for you, our donors, and store associates.

1. Please watch the following informative training video prior to bellringing: <https://f.io/ktgaXUbg>
2. Bell ringer PPE kits will be available for you to use during your shift, including: a disposable apron, mask, gloves and hand wipes. Please remember to follow state and local safety protocols.
3. Bell ringers are asked to wear a mask and maintain a safe social distance from other individuals.
4. Please follow CDC and local guidelines related to exposure and do not participate if exhibiting symptoms or have had any exposure to anyone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

General Guidelines, a few things to remember:

1. A kettle will be waiting for you with the prior ringer. If not, please go to customer service area to collect the kettle/stand and proceed to the front entrance.
2. At the end of your shift, please sanitize the kettle and equipment for the next bell ringer. If you are the last person on duty please put the kettle and stand back in the customer service area.
3. A representative of The Salvation Army will pick up the kettle at the end of the day, between 7:00 - 8:00 p.m.

Thank you for continuing to support The Salvation Army as a generous bell ringer. The funds raised in the kettles will stay in the community to provide much needed support for those in need.
